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# Safety Instructions

- Read the safety instructions carefully and thoroughly.
- All cautions and warnings on the device or user's manual should be noted.
- Refer servicing to qualified personnel only.
- Keep the User's Guide that comes with the package for future reference.

#### Precautions for use

- Before using the product, ensure that all cables are properly connected and that the power cord is not damaged, and contact your dealer immediately if there is any damage.
- Before connecting the device to the power outlet, make sure the power voltage is within its safety range, and right adjusted to the voltage which label marked. Do not disable the protective earth pin from the plug. The device must be connected to an earthed mains socket outlet.
- 3. This monitor should only be used with the type of power supply indicated on the label and with a matching power plug. If you do not know the type of power supply, please contact your dealer or local electricity company.
- 4. The monitor must be installed and fixed by professionals.
- 5. In order to prevent the danger of machine toppling, please ensure that any edge of the machine is within support, do not place the machine on an unstable, under-loaded cart, self or table.
- 6. Place the power cord in a way that people are unlikely to step on it. Do not place anything on the power cord.
- 7. Do not place the LCD monitor outdoors.
- Always disconnect the power cord or switch the wall socket off if the device would be left unused for a certain time to achieve zero energy consumption.
- In the event of a thunderstorm or when not in use for an extended period of time, unplug the power cord from the unit. Doing so will prevent damage to the display due to sudden voltage changes.
- 10. Monitor is moved from a low temp. area to a warm area, water droplets will be existence due to temperature difference, in order to make the water droplets fully disperse and dry, place monitor in a period of time before powering on .
- 11.Monitor should be placed in a well-ventilated environment.
- 12. To prevent the risk of fire or electric shock, do not expose the monitor to rain or moisture.

#### **Precautions For Use**

- 13. Do not place this monitor near radiators, heat sources or any other equipment that may interfere with proper ventilation.
- 14. Ventilation holes should not be covered with items such as newspaper, tablecloth, and curtains.
- 15. Do not cover the surface of the outdoor screen equipment to affect its cooling system.

If the machine has something wrong, please disconnect the circuit first then contact the manufacturer to solve the problem.

#### Repair

If any of the following situations arises, get the device checked by service personnel:



- The power cord or plug is damaged.
- Liquid has penetrated into the device.
- The device does not work well or you can not get it work according to user' s manual.
- The device has dropped and damaged.
- The device has obvious sign of breakage.

3. The power switch of monitor should be out of reach by children, to prevent children from touching the switch and causing danger.

#### **Cleaning and Maintenance**

- Before cleaning the screen, please unplug it from the power supply and ensure that the monitor is in a power-off state. Use a clean, soft, non-threaded cloth rather than industrial chemical to clean the device. Never pour any liquid into the opening; that could damage the device or cause electric shock.
- Please turn off the power of the monitor before cleaning and maintaining internal components.
- Do not apply liquid or spray cleaners directly to the monitor case and glass, please use a wet cloth to clean it.
- The dust on the glass and LCD screen of the machine also need to be cleaned regularly to ensure the clarity of the machine display.
- The machine needs regular maintenance, and the dust at the air inlet and outlet also need to be cleaned regularly, so that the machine can save the flow of air in and out, so machine can dissipate heat inside the machine better.
- Please press the leakage switch every 1-2 months to check whether it will automati-

#### Correct use

1. When using the crane, it is required to maintain a uniform speed and lift the left and right sides at the same time, and control the lifting speed to be very slow;

2. When using the crane, it is required to ensure that the rings on both sides have been installed and will not fall off easily; If the installation of the rings is unstable, please install the rings timely, otherwise the rings will be deformed and damaged during the lifting process, and the machine will fall and be damaged. The manufacturer does not recommend this method.

#### Wrong Usage

When using the crane, it is forbidden to hoist only one side. Because the structural balance of the machine is destroyed, the lifting ring will be deformed and damaged, and the machine will fall, which will affect the structural balance of the machine, resulting in the deformation and damage of one end marked in the figure.

When using the crane, the phenomenon in the picture is prohibited: using the same rope on the left and right sides to hoist the machine, which will cause the machine to be unstable, the rings will be deformed and damaged, and there is a risk of the machine slipping. The manufacturer



#### Wrong Usage

# **Recommended Installation Method**

Tip: Two hoists are required for installation.

3.Take out the lifting rings from the accessories box and install them on both sides of the machine, then two cranes lift the two ends respectively.

4. Move the machine (as shown), remove the bottom lifting eye, and install the base plate.

# **Recommended Installation Method**



5. Two hoists hook the upper ends of the machine respectively, and then slowly lift the machine.

(requires human assistance).

6. Hoist the machine to the reserved position and lower it slowly.





7. The bottom plate is aligned with the holes, and the screws are tightened, and the installation is completed.

#### Kindly Reminder:

Because the machine is used outdoors, It is recommended to use stainless steel screws during maintenance and installation to prevent the risk of rusting the screws.

#### **Recommended Installation Method**

- The monitor must be installed and fixed by professionals.
- To prevent the damage of the monitor, please firmly installed the LCD monitor on the ground or on the fixed bracket according to the instruction.
- Kindly reminder: because the machine is used outdoors, it is recommended to use stainless steel screws during maintenance and installation to prevent the risk of rusting the screws.



#### Correct use

1.When the base need to be installed, it is necessary to use the bottom bearing with a load of 500KG to elevate the whole machine to a position 5CM from the ground, as shown in the figure above;

2The machine need to be held in the front and behind, making sure that the machine is stable, confirm the screw hole position of the bottom bracket at a distance of 5CM from the bottom of the machine, and then fix the screw. It is forbidden to not check the hole position, and blindly or even violently install the screws, which will directly cause damage to the machine.





Wrong Usage

When installing the base, it is forbidden to directly lift the base after laying the machine down on the ground. It will cause damage to the inside of the machine and deformation damage to the inclined end of the machine because it destroys the balance of the machine structure.

# Packaging Method Of The Machine



 Remove the screws from the bottom plate of the machine and the ground, install the lifting ring on the top of the machine, put on the bag, and then slowly lift the machine.



 After putting the machine down the pearl cotton, remove the bottom plate, and install the lifting ring on the bottom.(requires manual assistance)



 Put the pearl cotton (or soft object) in advance, and put the machine on the pearl cotton (as shown in the picture)(requires human assistance).



4. Move the machine to a suitable location in the box.(requires manual assistance)



5. Load the remaining EPE and put in accessories



6. Pack the box and complete.
