

CLAIMS UNDER THE WARRANTY

To obtain Warranty Service, contact AmpliVox (800-267-5486) to be assigned a Return Authorization number (RA#). After receiving a RA#, the defective unit is to be returned to AmpliVox in either its original packaging or packaging affording an equal degree of protection. You will bear the cost of shipping the product to AmpliVox. If the product is covered by the warranty, AmpliVox will bear the cost of shipping product back to you after the completion of service under this warranty.

Return shipping will be charged to you for products not covered by the warranty or requiring no warranty repair.

The following information must be presented to obtain Warranty Service: (a) the RA# must be clearly and legibility marked on the outside of shipping carton, (b) proof of purchase, which clearly indicates the name and address of the seller, the date of purchase and the product type, which is evidence that this product is within the Warranty Period. Please further include (c) your return address, (d) daytime telephone number, and (e) reason for return.


LIMITATION OF WARRANTY

CONTROL PANEL



- 1 Power Switch
- 2 Power Indicator Light: Lights up when power is turned on.
- (3) Master Volume Control
- (4) Tone Control: Adjust Bass and Treble
- 5 Echo Control: Add more or less delay effect
- (6) RCA Jacks Volume Control: Control volume of input jack
- (7) **RCA Input Jacks:** Plug in audio source with RCA cable
- (8) RCA Output Jacks: Connect to audio recording source
- (9) External Speaker Jack: For cable with 1/4" male connector
- (10) Wired Microphone Jack: Plug in wired microphone with 1/4" male connector
- (11) Microphone Volume Control: Control wired microphone output
- (12) **DC Input Jack:** Plug one end of AC adapter cord into jack and the other end into AC outlet.
- (3) Charging / Low Battery Indicator: Flashing Green when charging, turns red when battery is low and needs to be charge. CHARGE IMMEDIATELY!
- (14) Fuse Holder
- (5) Voice Priority Function Switch: Facilitates announcements and paging by automatically reducing the volume of all the other inputs when switch to "ON" position


BATTERIES

- 1. Hold the body of microphone in hand and twist off bottom section of microphone.
- 2. Insert two "AA" batteries.
- 3. Twist bottom section back on to microphone.

BATTERY STATUS

The life expectancy of the two batteries is about 10 hours.

When the "BATTERY" symbol on the display screen keeps flashing the batteries should be replaced immediately.



Functions

- 1 Interchangeable Microphone Head
- (2) LCD Screen
- (3) Power / Mute Control Switch
- (4) Select Button
- (5) Microphone Input Sensitivity Ad-

justment—is used to set the gain of microphone. If you are a soft talking speaker you will need to turn the control counter clockwise. Turn clockwise if you are a loud talker. Use plastic screwdriver that is supplied.



- TURN ON MICROPHONE: Push and hold the "POWER/MUTE" 3 button until LCD screen lights up.
- TO MUTE: Press "POWER/MUTE" button twice to MUTE. Channel number
 will flash when muted. Press button again twice to remove "MUTE".
- TURN OFF MICROPHONE: Push and hold the "POWER/MUTE" (3) button for 2 seconds to turn microphone "OFF".



- SELECT CHANNEL (Manual): Press and hold the "SELECT" 4 button for 2 seconds until you only see the word Channel and channel number.
- To change channel, when flashing, press the "SELECT" (4) button until you reach the desired channel. Flashing will stop after 10 seconds and channel is now set.



LOCK / UNLOCK CHANNEL: Push the "POWER/MUTE" (3) button and
 "SELECT" button (4) at the same time to lock or unlock channel.


When locked, channel cannot be changed. "LOCKED" symbol appears in upper left-hand corner.



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WIRELESS RECEIVER

- ① IR WINDOW—Sends IR signal to the microphone transmitter to synchronize channel.
- 2 Power / Volume Switch
- (3) ASC: Push button to start auto synchronization.
- (4) Mute Level Adjustment
- (5) AF: Audio Frequency Indicator
- (6) RF: Radio Frequency Incicator
- (7) (8) Manual Channel UP / Down
- (9) Channel Display



RECEIVER SET-UP


The receiver has its own **POWER / VOLUME** Control ②. Turn Power On. A Frequency Channel will appear in the Channel Display ③ Press Select Buttons ⑦⑧ to select a channel. Channel number must match channel number on wireless microphone transmitter.

MUTE LEVEL (4) is set at half way mark when it leaves the factory. If speaker sound is breaking up, turn level clockwise with small screwdriver until condition improves.

WIRELESS HANDHELD MICROPHONE

Screw off the lower bottom section of microphone and insert 2 - "AA" 1.5 Volt alkaline batteries.

IMPORTANT: Because the microphone has an *AUTO SYNC* function, you first select channel you wish to use on the receiver. Then press the ASC button ③ the IR light will start to flash. Turn on microphone and point end of microphone at the flashing IR light on receiver and the microphone will auto sync to the same channel as selected on the receiver.

- 1. This portable amplifier is suitable for outdoor (not waterproof) and indoor audio including vocal and music playing.
- 2. High-quality, user replaceable rechargeable battery, which is convenient for both indoor and outdoor use.
- 3. Multiple input/output jacks can connect to nearly any audio device and broadcast for any moderate sized gathering.
- 4. Place on virtually any surface or use with tripod with built-in 5/8" dia. pole mount.
- 5. With 1 wired microphone input jack and up to 2 wireless microphones (optional 2nd wireless microphone not included) it can be used by multiple people simultaneously.

Setup and Installation

AC Operation

- 1. Turn Master Volume control to minimum setting.
- 2.Insert the DC plug, at the end of the AC adapter cord into the DC input jack.
- 3. Plug the AC adapter into the AC power outlet.
- 4. Turn on the power switch.

Battery Operation


1.To enable battery operation, first ensure that the internal battery is fully charged. To do this, follow the instructions below for AC Operation and let the battery charge for at least 12 hours.

RECHARGEABLE BATTERY

Typically the battery gives 3-4 hours of continuous operation after fully charged.

Charging Instructions:

- 1. Charge the battery for 12 hours before using.
- 2. Plug the external AC/DC power supply into outlet.
- 3. The CHARGING indicator will flash green. When the battery is full charged the indicator will be a steady green.
- 4. There is an automatic charging shut off. The charging circuit inside the battery will turn off by itself once the battery is charged.
 - This special overcharge protection control circuit will extend the battery life.
- 5. Charge the battery at least once a month.
- 6. When the LOW BATT light turns RED the battery should be charged immediately.
- 7. Remove the battery when not on use for extended periods (up to 10 days)


Maintenance Tips:

- 1. Charge the battery for 12 hours after use.
- 2. Charge the battery at least once a month
- 3. Battery specification is 12v/2.6AH. It can be recharged over 300 times if used correctly.
- 4. Using a different AC/DC adapter other then the one supplied may cause damage to the battery.

Notes:

- a. A low battery may caused distortion or unwanted noise. The battery should be charged immediately after use.
- b. Turn the power switch to OFF position after use.

Media Player / Remote Control Functions



- (1) Information Screen
- ② USB Socket: For Thumb drive memory device containing MP3 music files.
- ③ SD Card Socket: For SD memory card device containing MP3 music files.
- (4) Repeat Button: Repeats song currently playing. Press button again to cancel.
- (5) Previous / Volume Decrease: Press button to back up to previous song/folder when using USB/SD devices. Press to decrease volume of media player. This is in addition to the main volume control function.
- (§) Mode Button: Select between USB /SD / Bluetooth / FM Radio functions. For Bluetooth select ★ symbol. Pairing will automatically start. On you Bluetooth device select AMPLIVOX 725.
- Play / Pause Button: Start playback of current selection, and also stops the selection when pressed during playback. When pressed again, playback resumes at the point where the selection was stopped.
- (a) Record Button: Press to start recording to USB thumb drive or SD card using microphones.
- (9) Forward / Volume Increase: Press button to move to the next song / folder when using USB/SD devices. Press to increase volume of media player. This is in addition to the main volume control function.
- 10 Power Button: Press to turn on Media Player.
- (11) IR Port: Used for receiving signal from remote control.
- (2) Play Rec: Play previous recorded.
- (3) FM Search: Search for FM channels. (Not available)
- (14) Number Buttons
